




It has been pleasing to see so many students this first half term receiving a large number of achievement points for a variety of lessons and for consistently following the All Saints' Way (100% attendance and no behaviour points for the week). Students have also been nominated by their subject teachers to receive a praise postcard for an excellent start to the year and these will be handed out by SLT this week and the first week after half term so well done to all students nominated.

As we approach half term 2 there will be other opportunities including celebrating students with excellent



conduct points (certificates and being entered into a prize drawer) and rewarding students who consistently follow the All Saints' Way with a Christmas treat!



Well done to all our students who have made such a positive start to the school year and particularly those who have maintained 100% school attendance.

Across the school; 516 students (54.9% of our students) have achieved 100% attendance

609 students (64.8% of our students) have 96% attendance or above.

We have continued to work very closely with students, parents and carers and would like to thank them for their ongoing support in

ensuring their child attends school where possible and when they have been too poorly for school, have

followed the official guidelines which has helped us to keep all our students, staff and families safe. The rigorous systems we have implemented have ensured that All Saints' has remained open to as many

students as possible and other schools in the area will be implementing similar systems after the half term break. Students have continued to work at home where school attendance hasn't been possible and are all

now back in school being fully supported with their studies.

We take pride in continually striving to raise our standards to higher levels and by doing this, we are providing our students with the very best opportunities for a successful start in life.

Most importantly, it is our students who will be reaping the benefits through their achievements!



I am delighted to see how well our new year 7 students have settled into All Saints' and secondary school life.
