**Oil millionaire's son, 14, 'found murdered in flat 30 miles from home after being groomed through computer games'**

**Digital disabilities – text neck, cellphone elbow – are painful and growing**

**Too much exposure to smartphone screens ruins your sleep, study shows**

**Wave of sexting by school children raises fears of grooming**




# Logging in

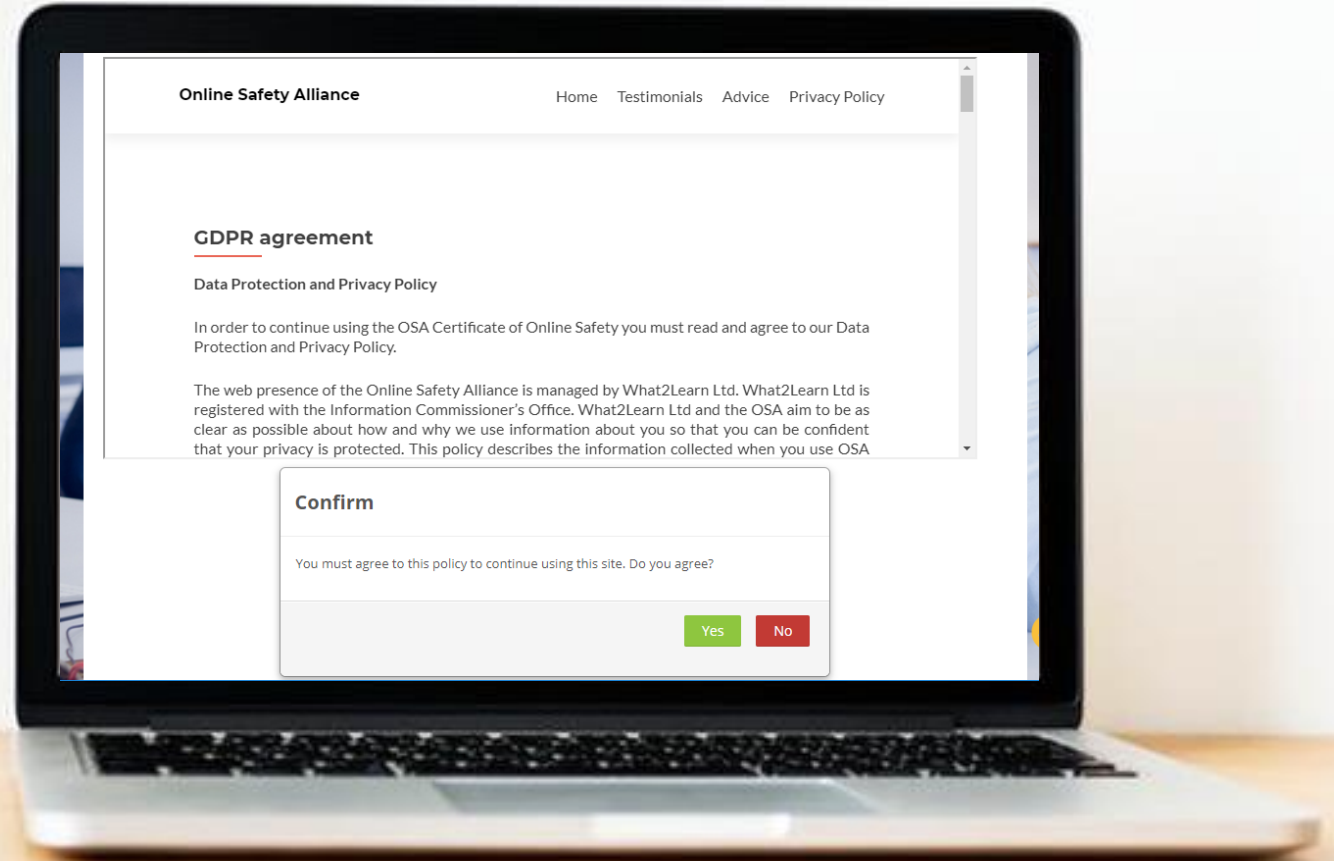


The first time you log in you will be shown our data protection and privacy policy. You need to press the green 'Yes' button to agree to this before you can access the Certificate.





# Accessing your course

# Accessing your course


The first time you access your course you will need to enter an enrolment key.

This is:

- For Key Stage 3 (Y7/8): **allsaints3**
- For Key Stage 4 (Y9-11): **allsaints4**
- For Key Stage 5 (Y12/13): **allsaints5**

Type in the key and then press the green 'Enrol me' button.

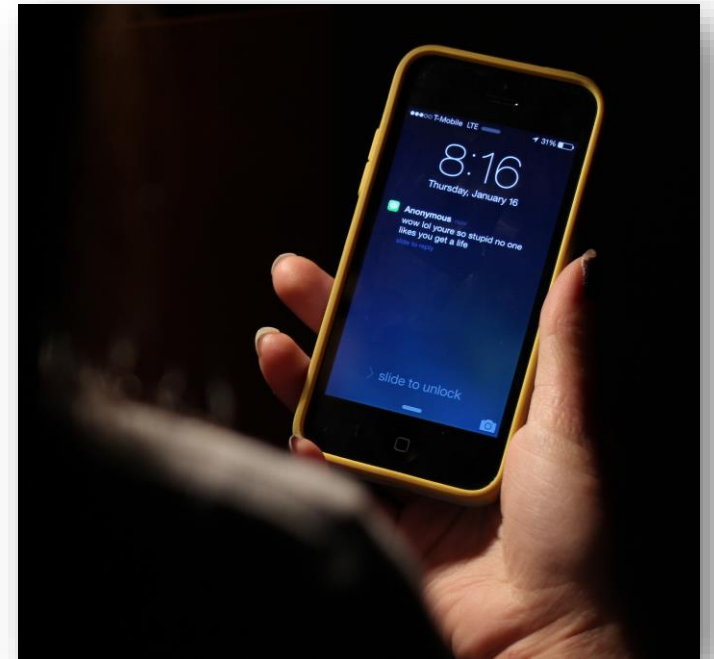


# Completing your course
