Attendance

It is important for your child to regularly attend school for a variety of reasons - the learning and social skills developed, and for their confidence and self-esteem. Obviously, your child may miss school due to sickness or a hospital appointment but holidays should not be taken in term time. There are very few reasons a Headteacher can authorise a child being off school. Unauthorised absences may result in a penalty notice being given which is currently £120 (or £60 if paid within 28 days)

We also have a few children coming into school after 8.55am. Being late for school causes significant disadvantages to children. They not only miss the introduction to the lesson, but also the opportunity to meet and socialise with classmates before lessons begin. Children coming into class late causes disruption to the whole class and regular lateness may well result in your child being unable to reach their full potential.

Period 1 starts at 8.55am. If your child arrives to school after this time, then they will receive late mark and potentially a lunch detention or afterschool detention. This does not include students late due to the school buses.

If your child is going to be absent, please inform school using the Arbor App providing full details or by calling 01623 474700 and press 1 for pupil absence. A phone call or home visit will be made if we have not received any information that explains your child's absence by 9.30am.

Uniform reminders

For the PE kit, a reminder about the policy on PE bottoms:

Plain black <u>tracksuit</u> bottoms / leggings (no different colours / no patterns / no stripes / no mesh or vent panels in leggings. Only one small logo no wider than 5cm). These should be proper tracksuit bottoms not joggers.

Please remember that on PE days, the trainers worn must be supportive with a good sole (for health and safety reasons fashion trainers, such as AF1, converse/boots or plimsolls are not permitted in or out of PE

lessons). Also, please see the poster from Price and Buckland later in the bulletin regarding deadlines for ordering uniform. The school wear centre in Mansfield also supplies our uniform.



MARINE BIOLOGIST

AVERAGE SALARY £20,000-£60,000

As we gear up to celebrate World Ocean Day on the 8th of June, it is the perfect time to look at a career centred around protecting the sea: a Marine Biologist. This role involves understanding the sea's inhabitants, uncovering the impacts of human activity on marine ecosystems, and finding ways to preserve the ocean's natural beauty for future generations. So, if you have a passion for science and an interest in the ocean, this might just be the role for you!

JOB DESCRIPTION

Marine Biologists play a critical role in studying ocean life, from the tiniest organisms to the largest marine mammals. Their work is essential for understanding how to protect marine species and their habitats, contributing to efforts against environmental challenges and ensuring the health of our ocean.

OUALIFICATIONS

If you can 'sea' yourself as a Marine Biologist, you'll need a keen interest in Science and Maths. After school or college, a degree in marine biology, oceanography, or a related field, such as environmental science, is the first step toward this career. If you want to go one step further, completing a master's or PhD will open doors to advanced research positions and specialisations.



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
