Happy New Year! I hope you all enjoyed a peaceful and restful Christmas.


The start of a new term brings new challenges and new things to look forward to.



Below is a list of recommended reads for anyone who received a book token for Christmas and is unsure what to buy or for anyone who just fancies treating themselves to a new book!

Silver in the Bone by Alexander Bracken

When Tamsin hears about a magical ring from the Arthurian legend that can break a curse on her brother, she decides to track it down. Doing so requires her to team up with her rival and face sorceresses, dark magic, and her long-lost foster father.

The Legacies by Jessica Goodman

In The Legacies, seniors from New York City's vaunted prep schools find themselves at the center of a murder. There's a secret society called the Legacy Club and their ritzy party, the Legacy Ball. And at the end of the night, a body gets removed from the premises.

Thieves' Gambit by Kayvion Lewis

The youngest member of the legendary Quest family, 17-year-old Rosalyn has no intention of joining the Thieves' Gambit, an ultra-secret, no-holds-barred competition to determine the world's greatest thief. When her mother is kidnapped, though, Ross has no choice but to enter - and to play to win, against both an old enemy and a fascinating new flame. 




This term our exciting lunchtime Book Club starts. The club will run every Wednesday lunchtime in M22.
