JULY 2024 PRAYER PREPARING FOR

Theme: Displaced Peoples

Scripture – "There are many rooms in my Father's house"

Every year, millions of people are forced to leave their homes due to conflict, violence, human rights violations, persecution, disasters, and the impacts of climate change. The number of forcibly displaced persons reached unprecedented heights in 2023, calling for increased humanitarian assistance.

By the end of June 2023, 110 million people were displaced worldwide, while UNHCR projects that there will be more than 130 million forcibly displaced persons in 2024. Around 52% of all these refugees originated from only 3 countries: Syria, Ukraine, and Afghanistan. The EU is the leading international donor in situations of forced displacement. Displacement lasts 20 years on average for refugees and more than 10 years for most Internally Displaced Persons.

Lord Jesus, give us more of your compassion for the plight of displaced persons, soften our hearts to their situation, and help us follow your lead in seeking justice and mercy on their behalf. We pray for an end to the wars, poverty and human rights abuses that drive desperate people to become refugees in the first place. Amen

THANKS!! Digital and Online giving to Our Lady of Lourdes Parish

Many thanks to those parishioners, and visitors, who have over the last few weeks either used the electronic donation machine at St Philips or the QR code to contribute to the parish. As you will have seen, it is not complicated.....

This additional way of giving to the weekly collection has seen an increase week on week over the short period since we adopted it as an additional method of giving for the increasing number of people who don't carry cash (these are in the main 'younger' people). As was said earlier, it works alongside our current method of collections – there is no need to change the way you currently give.

The QR code or machine can now also be used for **second collections** and **other donations** if you so wish. Either scan the code [below] on your smart phone or try the machine if you are in St Philip Neri.

The first time a person uses their card to donate, they are asked if they wish to gift aid the amount. If you are a tax payer we encourage this. The process takes less than 1 minute to complete.....

Any future donations will be automatically gift aided and take 5 seconds to donate.
