

Key information for GCSE History.

In order to prepare your child for their upcoming examination, we wanted to share some key information in this pack.

- 1. QR codes these can be scanned on a phone, and will take your child directly to revision videos to use for the four topics that we study.
- 2. Your child will find a number of resources for each paper using the following Pathway on the VLE. Subjects/History/1.Y11 Revision and Exam Prep
- 3. QR codes of where to purchase the relevant revision guides cards. These links are for the same guides that have previously been available through school, so you don't need to duplicate if you purchased these previously.
- 4. Full revision checklists for the final examinations.
- 5. How to revise for History, and how you can help your child. We would recommend going onto the VLE where there is a wide array of past paper exam questions, these are a great way to revise as they help the pupils to identify gaps in their knowledge, and then they can use revision guides and their work booklets to recap this knowledge and fill in the gaps. Please encourage your child to look beyond the absolutes as a source of revision, and use their exercise books and booklets which have more depth. We also have essentials sheets for a number of topics, on the VLE, you could use these to test your child on simple knowledge recall. This will help with the depth and range of specific details required for their examination.


