



- The summer exam will be sat in 3 papers, 2 of 90 minutes and 1 of 60 minutes.
- The exam is time pressured. Students must practice writing clear, concise answers to the different question types.
- Each paper has specific elements that apply only to that one, make sure your students know what goes where.

2. Mock Exam Importance:

 Mocks help identify strengths and areas for improvement before the final exams. Encourage your child to treat these as real exams.

3. Sources of Authority:

- Students need to refer to Catholic sources like the Bible, Catechism, and teachings from the Magisterium in their answers. Understanding these is crucial for achieving higher marks.
- The exam is time-pressured. Students must practice writing clear, concise answers to the different question types.

Tips for Parents to Support Revision

1. Encourage Use of Sources of Authority:

 Ask your child to explain key sources (e.g., biblical passages, catechisms) and their practical applications.

2. Practice Timed Questions:

o Encourage timed completion of past papers to improve exam technique.

3. **Discussion-Based Learning:**

 Engage in discussions on topics like forgiveness or capital punishment, asking your child to explain and justify beliefs.

4. Quiz your child:

 Ask them to write a series of questions with answers, then you quiz them at home.

5. Regular Check-ins:

• Review your child's revision progress using available resources and checklists.
