Dress Code:

Here is a reminder of our Sixth Form Dress Code. We recognise that Sixth Form students have special privileges and should be able to wear their own choice of clothes rather than school uniform. Whilst respecting student individuality, dress at All Saints' Sixth Form must reflect that the primary purpose of attending Sixth Form is to learn. Dress should be respectful to individuals and the school environment. In interpreting the guidelines students should ensure their overall appearance is appropriate and reflects the ethos of the school.

Given the evolving nature of fashion, All Saints' Sixth Form reserves the right to add to these requirements and determine that particular items are not appropriate. Students are expected to exercise mature judgement in their choices.
