## Dress Code:

Here is a reminder of our Sixth Form Dress Code, as the weather gets warmer, let's all work together to ensure our students are appropriately dressed

We recognise that Sixth Form students have special privileges and should be able to wear their own choice of clothes rather than school uniform. Whilst respecting student individuality, dress at All Saints' Sixth Form must reflect that the primary purpose of attending Sixth Form is to learn. Dress should be respectful to individuals and the school environment. In interpreting the guidelines students should ensure their overall appearance is appropriate and reflects the ethos of the school.

During the warmer months of the year students are reminded that they are in school not a college and will therefore come into contact with much younger students throughout the day. For this reason, very short, tight or revealing clothing is deemed inappropriate and will be challenged.

Given the evolving nature of fashion All Saints' Sixth Form reserves the right to add to these requirements and determine that particular items are not appropriate. Students are expected to exercise mature judgement in their choices.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>•Skimpy shorts or hot pants</li><li>•Clothing with offensive logos or slogans</li><li>•Bare midriff</li><li>•No underwear should be visible</li><li>•Sheer, low cut tops or spaghetti straps</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>•Dresses, skirts, jumpsuits and shorts with a hem line which falls appropriately at lower thigh or below.</li><li>•Trousers/ Jeans/ Chinos/ leggings/ joggers</li><li>•T-shirts, blouses, tops and shirts.</li><li>•Hoodies, blazers and jackets.</li><li>•Where trousers/ jeans are ripped, these should be minimal and only knees exposed.</li></ul>

## Study Tip:

Revision needs to be a minimum 3 step process:

3. Apply the information to an examination question
4. Can an examination question be completed in timed conditions?
5. Use a mark scheme to check or ask a member of staff to mark for you.
