### CELEBRATING OUR FAITH

Year 10, Caritas House, enjoyed a fruitful Retreat Day on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> March, beginning with Mass in St Philip Neri Church, where Fr Liam preached about ways we can be inspired by scripture and the example of Jesus, especially during the season of Lent. He continued to speak about the need to live lives of love and of the example of our house patron, St Teresa of Calcutta, who reminded us, in her words (our Y10 House Motto) that we can all 'do small things with great love.' He also reminded us that Lent is a great liturgical season in which we can embrace the opportunity to 'factory reset, like our phones, through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, inviting the young people and staff to come to Confession. The day continued with three class-based sessions, focusing on places we can seek divine inspiration - through scripture, the seasons and the saints - and the ways that we can pray through these opportunities. The young people enjoyed 'creating and reflecting' and said 'it's great to take a pause from academic learning and think about some of the things that help us to be better people, especially during Lent'.
