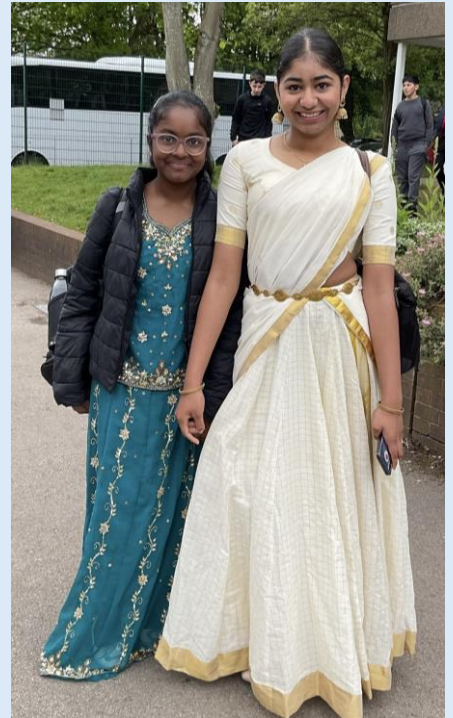




World Culture Day

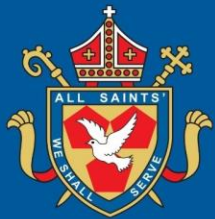

On Friday 22nd May Year 7 completed a sponsored Colour Dash – money is still being collected, but the last count took us to over £700 raised.

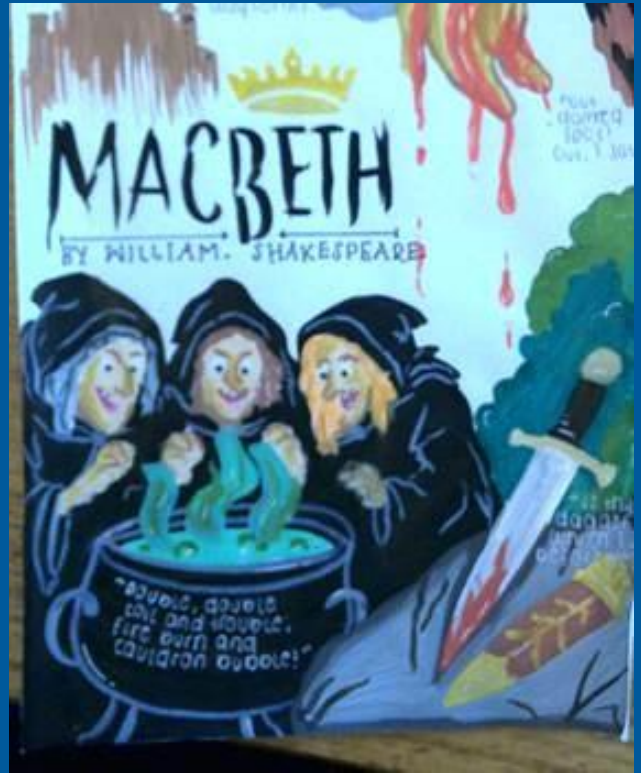

Safeguarding Update

Online gaming is part of everyday childhood, Ofcom data puts regular online gaming among more than three quarters of teenagers, with some starting as young as three or four. For many children it's simply an extension of their social world, and that's worth acknowledging. But the risks are significant: stranger contact through in-game chat, loot box mechanics that mirror gambling, and content well beyond what parents assume their children are accessing. Roblox, popular with primary-age children, has been linked to exposure to extremist content. The Educator Magazine has published a practical article making the case for a school-led approach to supporting parents on this. You can find out more here:

Unifrog

A reminder that all students have access to this careers platform



What is Unifrog?

Unifrog is designed to support learners in making informed decisions about their futures, with a range of tools that are suitable for all year groups. Each student has their own account that provides a range of information related to their interests and aspirations.

Key features of the platform for students include:

- Psychometric testing quizzes
- Career and subject exploration
- Webinars and interactive short courses
- Self-reflection and portfolio building tools
- Search tools for live apprenticeship and employer opportunities, and university courses
- Application and essay-building tools

We encourage you to use the platform with your child so you can support them through the process of deciding on their next steps. To do this, we've set up a parent login so that you can use Unifrog as if you were a student yourself, allowing you to access the same resources and tools as your child.

To make your account, go to unifrog.org/code and input the sign-up code **ALSCparents**. You can also sign up to Unifrog's parent / caregiver newsletter to get expert advice and guidance on supporting your child with their next steps.
