November is the month of the Holy Souls. During this month we pray especially for our departed friends and loved ones on the last great journey towards the eternal light of God. As Catholics we believe that although those who have died are separated from us physically, they remain connected to us as members of the Church. **Holy Souls Envelopes:** We continue the tradition of placing the names of your deceased family, friends and relatives by the altar during November. Envelopes will be available for you to take from church for this purpose. If you are not currently able to get Mass, please feel free to email your list to the parish, stating clearly which church (St Patrick's or St Joseph's) you wish the lists to be placed in.

WEDNESDAY, 11th NOVEMBER: On this anniversary of the Armistice which ended World War I, we remember all those who have died in conflict through the ages.

Spiritual Communion *There are times when people are unable to receive the Body and Blood of Christ, through illness or due to their personal disposition. Even though some may not receive 'sacramental' Communion, all are united in some way by the Holy Spirit. The traditional idea of 'spiritual' Communion is an important one to remember and reaffirm. A deep spiritual communion is possible even when we do not share together the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ. (cf. Celebrating the Mass 212)*

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in this Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love you above all things and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen

With this our second lockdown, sadly the celebration of the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion have had to be postponed once again. Naturally, the children and their parents are upset. Please continue to pray for them. As soon as our churches are allowed to reopen for public worship, these sacraments will be celebrated. In the meantime, I will continue to work with the children until they have made their First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS: Attendance at Masses in both churches will be by pre-booking only. Booking details are on the front of this newsletter. It is on a first-come-first-served basis and a waiting list system will be in place so please contact us if, having booked, you are unable to attend. Social distancing will be set at 2m, so please observe this as you arrive and leave church. If you are in the extremely clinically vulnerable (shielding) category, then please continue to protect yourself by staying at home and praying for the parish community or a live streamed Mass. The Sunday obligation continues to be suspended, so if you are unsure about coming, do not feel under any obligation to attend. If you or someone in your household displays symptoms of Covid19, then please stay at home. Stewards will assist in arriving and leaving church to that people are kept safe. Parishioners are strongly advised not to car share or offer lifts to people outside their household. **Only funerals can now be celebrated in church but numbers are limited to 30.**
